




The Kid Who Came from Space is our first-ever Year 6 citywide read!

Bake a cake or cakes with a space theme. You could try space rock cakes!


GET CREATIVE

Create a map of the village labelling the places in the book.


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Design a new planet in the solar system and create a set of rules that its inhabitants have to live by.
