Diana Evans is a British author of Nigerian and English descent. Her bestselling debut novel, *26a*, won the inaugural Orange Award for New Writers and the British Book Awards deciBel Writer of the Year Prize. Her second novel, *The Wonder*, was also published to critical acclaim and is currently being adapted for TV.

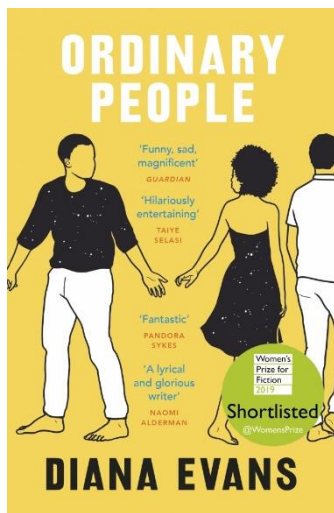
Diana was nominated for the Andrew Carnegie Medals for Excellence in Fiction for her third novel, *Ordinary People*. The book was a *New Yorker*, *New Statesman* and *Financial Times* book of the year. It was shortlisted for the Women's Prize for Fiction, the Rathbone Folio Prize and the Orwell Prize for Political Fiction. It also won the South Bank Sky Arts Award for Literature.



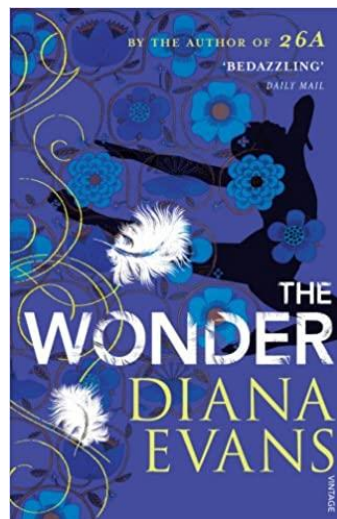

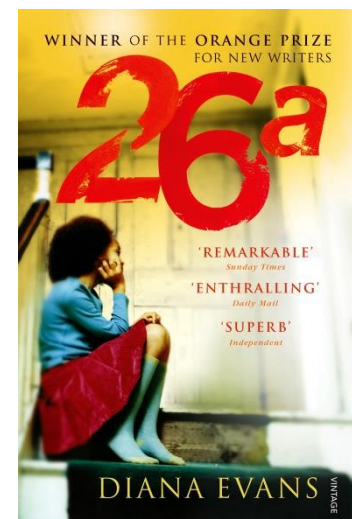
