Our mission

The National Literacy Trust empowers children, young people and adults from disadvantaged communities with the literacy skills they need to succeed. We work directly with young people and their families, with the 5,000 schools in these communities, with nurseries, prisons, YOIs and through our teams leading community literacy programmes in 20 places in the UK facing the biggest literacy and poverty challenges. Our research makes us the leading authority on literacy and drives all our work. We are committed to becoming a more diverse and inclusive charity, better at listening to and working in partnership with the communities we exist to serve. Literacy is a vital element of action against poverty and our work changes people's life stories.

Purpose of role

Our criminal justice work includes projects across men's and women's prisons, as well as Young Offender Institutions. Everything we do centres confidence-building, wellbeing and increased access to creative literacy opportunities.



<u>Books Unlocked</u> has been running for 12 years and now promotes reading for enjoyment in more than 100 prisons across the UK. Our <u>New Chapters</u> project enables participants to express themselves through creative writing, and <u>Readconnect</u> uses the power of storytelling to support connections between people in prison and their children and young relatives. <u>Inside Stories with Audible gives</u> young people in custody access to audiobooks and podcast making skills, and our <u>national project</u>, funded by the Ministry of Justice, means we are able to provide literacy as enrichment as part of a national pilot.

These programmes are a vital part of our ambitious strategy, helping us deliver our mission to reach some of the most disadvantaged and vulnerable people in custody and the community. Innovation is encouraged and you will have the flexibility to tailor your work to meet the needs of each cohort that we work with.

You will be responsible for a project, funded by the HMPPS Literacy Innovation Fund, which supports literacy activities outside of formal education provision. You will deliver a range of exciting reading and writing interventions and events in HMP Swaleside (a Category B men's prison with a capacity of just over 1,000) and HMP Elmley (a Category B/C local prison with a capacity of just under 1,000), both based on the Isle of Sheppey in Kent.
