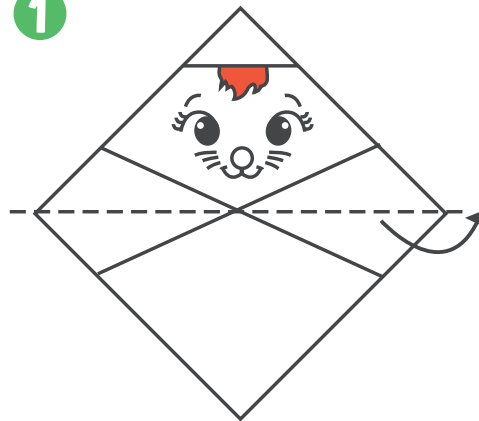
Create your own paper cat using traditional Japanese origami techniques and the template below.

Don't forget to give your origami character a name. Can you write or think of a fun story together? Or, why not draw a new fantasy land where they live or come from?

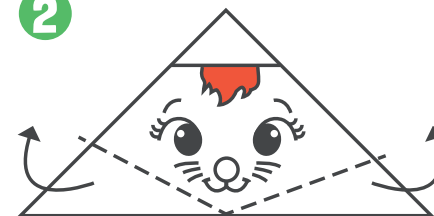
Using this Japanese technique is a fun and easy way to boost creativity, imagination and build curiosity. It also helps to improve observation and attention to details.

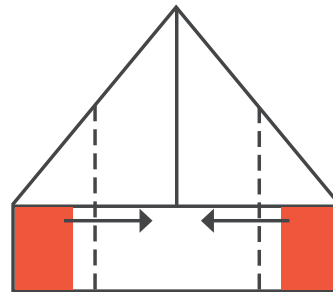
## Rocket



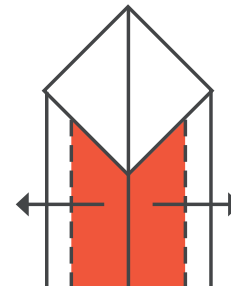
**1**  
Fold along the dotted line in the direction of the arrow



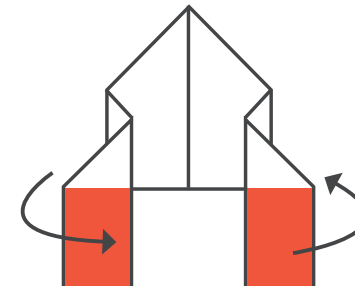
**2**  
Fold back the two corners along the dotted line and turn back



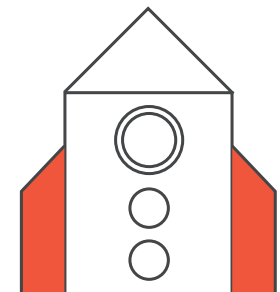
**3**
