



### Terms and Conditions for The World of Graphic Novels reading challenge

- a. These terms and conditions apply to The World of Graphic Novels reading challenge. The promoter is the National Literacy Trust. Amazon is not a promoter of or responsible for The World of Graphic Novels reading challenge.
- b. The eligible age for entries to this challenge is students aged between 7 and 14 years (Key Stages 2 and 3, or P4 to S3). Entrants must have parent/guardian permission.
- c. The closing date for entries is 23.59 on 13 December 2024
- d. Entries are to be submitted by an entrant's school via the submission form on [the website](#)
- e. Eligible entries are PDFs of the *Design Template* resource (or self-designed comic of up to twelve panels) showing students' engagement with the challenge. This can be completed by an individual, a student pair, a small group or a full class. Do not submit more than two entries per class. Entries are submitted via the submission form on [the website](#)
- f. All entries will be submitted to Amazon staff who have volunteered to judge each entry. The winning schools will be informed by the end of January 2025.
- g. Five schools will be chosen as prize winners. Each of the prize winning schools will receive a £1,000 donation from Amazon to develop and expand their library offering.
- h. The general terms and conditions for Reading Champions Challenges shall apply.

1. National Literacy Trust Reading Challenges are open to all UK schools. Schools may run the challenge without choosing to submit an entry.
2. Reading Challenges are free of charge to enter.

3. Entries must be submitted by a member of school staff supplying their full contact details and entry documentation/evidence as set out on the challenge webpage.
4. No responsibility is accepted for entries lost, damaged or delayed as a result of any network, computer hardware or software failure of any kind. Proof of entry will not be accepted as proof of receipt.
5. There will not be a notification of receipt for entries.
6. Prizes offered are non-transferable and non-exchangeable. However, in the event of unforeseen circumstances the promoter reserves the right to offer alternative prizes of equal value.
7. Winning schools will be notified using the contact details supplied for entry, and asked to acknowledge the notification.
8. If we do not receive confirmation of acceptance within 28 days of notification the prize will be forfeited and a new winning school will be selected.
9. By accepting a prize the winning school will consent to their success being publicly announced by the National Literacy Trust in newsletters, on our website and those of any Reading Challenge partners, and in other media. You will never be approached directly by a journalist.
10. By taking part in this promotion, all entrants will be deemed to have accepted and be bound by these terms and conditions.
